Family Literacy Day happens every year on January 27, and offers us a great reminder that we can learn from everyday moments. Learning does not have to be expensive, hard, or complicated, and learning can happen at any time.

This year, we encourage everyone to "take five and read" – whether you read with a child, an adult, a family member, friend or perfect stranger. Taking five minutes to read on Family Literacy Day, or all week long, can reinforce the importance of strong reading, writing, math, and

computer skills.

Additional ideas for incorporating Family Literacy Day into School and family learning fun can be as simple as 1, 2, 3.

Help children have fun with words. Encourage knock-knock jokes, look for the alphabet while traveling, or write a story, poem, or note to someone special.

Have fun with numbers. Ask children to think about how they use numbers in everyday life - while cooking and measuring ingredients for recipes, playing hide-and-seek, or when planning a trip.

Have fun with computers. Develop children's technology literacy skills by reading

an e-book story, playing educational games, researching the answer to a question, or even writing their own story and emailing it to friends and family.

Since 1999, when Family Literacy Day began, the Quebec City Reading Council has been helping local families enjoy this day. It is a fun opportunity to remember the importance of reading, writing, math and computers, and sharing ideas about how to have fun with everyday learning.
